



## Simplified Non- Football Power Rating Scale- 4-17-12

Teams will receive:

1. Seven points for each win
2. One point for each loss to a school one level above their classification.
3. Two points for each loss to a school two levels above their classification.
4. Three points for each loss to a school three levels above their classification.
5. Four points for each loss to a school four levels above their classification.
6. Five points for each loss to a school five levels above their classification.

The total number of points obtained will be divided by the total number of contests played to provide a power rating average for that team.

### Examples

A Classification 2 school in a district with Classification 4 and 5 schools has a 7-13 record with six losses to class 4 schools and seven losses to class 5 schools.

7 wins x 7points	49 points
6 losses to class four schools x 2 points	12 points
7 losses to class five schools x 3 points	<u>21 points</u>
	82 total points

82 points divided by 20 games = 4.1 power rating

A Classification 2 school in with Classification 2 and 1 schools has a record of 12-8 with four losses to class 2 schools and four losses to class 1 schools

12 wins x 7 points

84 points

0 points for losses to classes above

0 points

84 total points

84 divided by 20 games = 4.2 power rating

While this rating COULD be used independently as a qualifying mechanism, it could also be used with other qualifying criteria such as district champion and district tournament champion.

The following are tiebreaker procedures for seeding in a conference tournament.

**Tiebreaker criteria must apply to all involved in order to be considered.**

1. Head to Head.
2. District Champion.
3. Percentage vs. common opponents of the same classification.
4. Percentage vs. all opponents of the same classification.
5. Percentage vs. common opponents of all classifications.
6. Percentage vs. only VHSL member opponents
7. District Tournament Champion.
8. Lot draw
