1. If a golfer has shot a score of 50 or below (with the boys team or at a girls match on a regulation course) they will not need to play on September 26th or October 3rd. They have already qualified for the October 17th Zone Qualifier.
If your player has already scored a 50 or below, please send name, date and course played so I can keep track of these players.
2. When registering players:
 - Submit actual scores if your golfer has played matches on a regulation course.
 - Submit projected score if they have not played.
 - Rank players. Number 1 is the player you most want to play; the last player is the player you wish to play the least. All of your players may not get in (depending on numbers). These events are NOT a practice round. They are for golfers who have not shot 50 or below.
 - Tee times will be determined by actual/projected score.
 - Please indicate if you cannot make a tee time.
3. Have players ready and on first tee 15 minutes before assigned tee time.

Coaches should submit names of players, along with a 9 hole score to Aaron Helmick at abhelmick@fcps.edu by the published deadline dates. Tee times will be sent out ASAP.

A coach or school representative must be present for a golfer to be allowed to play.

All players should be ready to go at the tee time appointed. If any player is late, they will be moved to the back of the field and will go out time permitting.

Please do everything you can to help ensure as many girls finish as possible. Coaches are expected to help monitor the golfers to ensure a good pace of play. At dark I will call the match.

Practice: Each player will be provided practice balls the day of tournament.

Scoring: After 18 holes, the 20% with lowest scores will qualify for the State Tournament.

Entry Forms: Completed entry forms (found in the VHSL Principal's Workbook) must be completed and sent electronically to Aaron Helmick at abhelmick@fcps.edu no later than Thursday October 13th, 2016.

Dress Code: Golfers must wear proper golf attire. Soft spikes only. Players not complying may be disqualified by the tournament director.

Pairings: The tournament will start at 10:00. Tee times will be determined by the best scores going off first on tees 1 and 10. I will adjust pairings so that no group has two golfers from the same school.

Coaches meeting: All coaches are expected at the course at 9:00 a.m. on Monday Oct. 17th for our coaches meeting. We will meet briefly to discuss any issues, review the tournament format and answer any questions. This will be followed by a players/coaches meeting in which rules will be clarified, score cards handed out, and a brief question/answer period.

Carts: All golfers will walk and carry their own bags. No players are to be on the course with a cart. One cart will be assigned to each school for use by the coach only. Coaches are to monitor their golfers and interpret any rules at the request of the tournament director and lead official from VSGA.

Playing etiquette: From the Virginia High School League Handbook:

70-1-2 Playing Etiquette

- 1) A player will not be permitted to throw or abuse any piece of equipment during the match.
Penalty – Such action constitutes a sportsmanship violation and must be reported to the VHSL office.
- 2) A player shall not use profanity during a match.
