**MEMORANDUM TO:** State Scholastic Bowl Participating Schools

**RE:** State Competition

Welcome to VHSL's 19<sup>th</sup> annual state academic competition, Scholastic Bowl. You are to be congratulated on your achievement in surviving conference and regional competition and qualifying for state, and we look forward to having you join us at the College of William and Mary in Williamsburg on Saturday, Feb. 27. The university's invitation to host the event has permitted us to do a number of things that we believe will make this a very special event.

We are forwarding the following information to help you prepare for what we hope will be a tremendously rewarding experience. **Each team should also bring its buzzer system**, which would only be used in case of emergency.

The university is easily accessible off I-64 at the exit for Colonial Williamsburg. Signs for William and Mary mark the exit from the interstate and the path from the interstate to the school. You may also refer to the city map inset on the enclosed college map. Some cars should be able to park Saturday morning on Stadium Drive next to the football stadium, and that is very convenient to the two buildings we are using for competition. Visitors may use faculty/staff spots but may not use spots marked "reserved at all times." Buses and vans may drop students off in front of Sadler Center (formerly University Center), 86 on the map, and then park near William and Mary Hall, number 90, on Brooks Street, adjacent to the parking lot (pink on the map). Each coach should register the team at Sadler Center, and most of the competition will take place in that building. Groups 5A and 6A competition for the first three rounds is set for James Blair Hall, 8 on the map, directly east of Sadler Center.

Registration in Sadler Center begins at 8:30, with a continental breakfast provided by the university and VHSL at 7:30. The Opening Assembly is at 10:00. Beyond that, the schedule for the day can be found on the attachment. We are using a round robin format so that each school will compete against every other school in their region. Trophy presentations will immediately follow the final matches, and we expect to be finished by 2:40 or by 3:25 if a tie-breaker round is needed.

There is a 75-minute lunch break. There are a number of options: a cafeteria in Sadler Center will be open. There are also delicatessens along Richmond Road at the other end of Stadium Drive, and of course, some participants may want to visit the restaurants and shops along Duke of Gloucester Street between William and Mary and the Colonial Village.

Fine Designs will be in the Sadler Center lobby with a selection of T-shirts and sweat shirts students will want as mementos of this experience. Most of the shirts will be imprinted with the names of all student participants.

Students arriving early should not be at a loss for activities Friday evening. Colonial Williamsburg is one of the nation's premiere tourist attractions. Hotel accommodations are a reasonable price should not be an issue. Please let us know if you need a listing of hotels in the area.

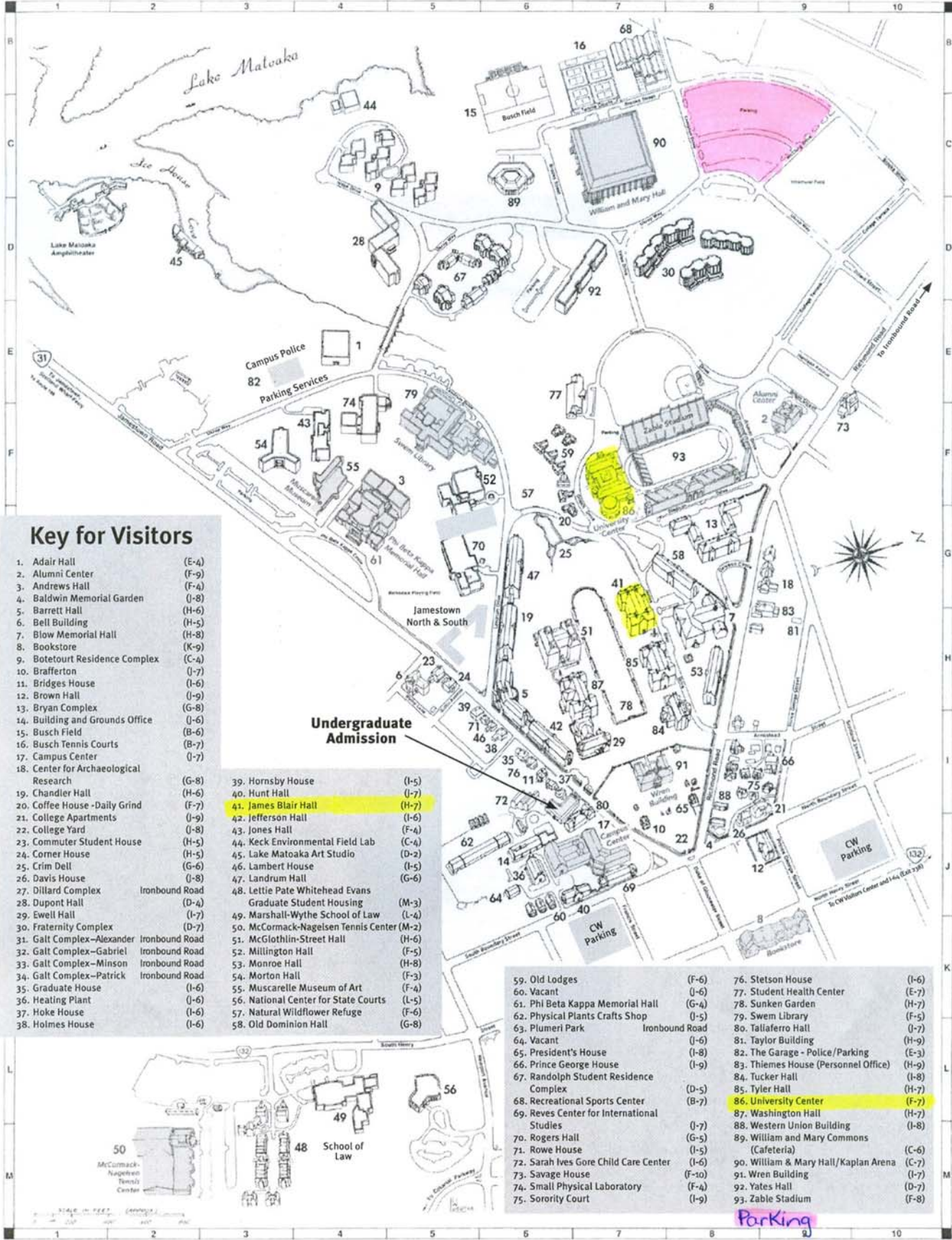
## Directions to College of William & Mary, Williamsburg

The Sadler Center (SC) really doesn't have a street address. It's located off Richmond Road and is adjacent to the stadium. Here's some text about getting to campus in general and a few links.

William and Mary is located in Williamsburg, Virginia. The campus is 150 miles south of Washington, D.C., midway between Richmond and Norfolk on I-64. From I-64, take Exit 238. At the second set of lights (Route 132), turn right. Turn right again at the next set of lights (Route 60 Bypass). Follow Bypass Road to where it ends and intersects with Richmond Road. Bypass Road forks just before Richmond Road. Turn left on Richmond Road. At the third set of lights, you will see the Walter F. Zable Stadium on the right.

The Sadler Center (SC) is next to/behind the stadium. Folks should turn into the stadium (a right, following the directions above) and park in the lot in front of/next to the stadium. The SC is at the end of the parking lot. Buses and vans should drop off students at Sadler Center and park at William and Mary Hall. Someone will be at Sadler Center to meet buses. He/she will have directions for parking buses. The parking lot across from William and Mary Hall (pink on the map) is the overflow location for cars unable to find space on Stadium Drive.

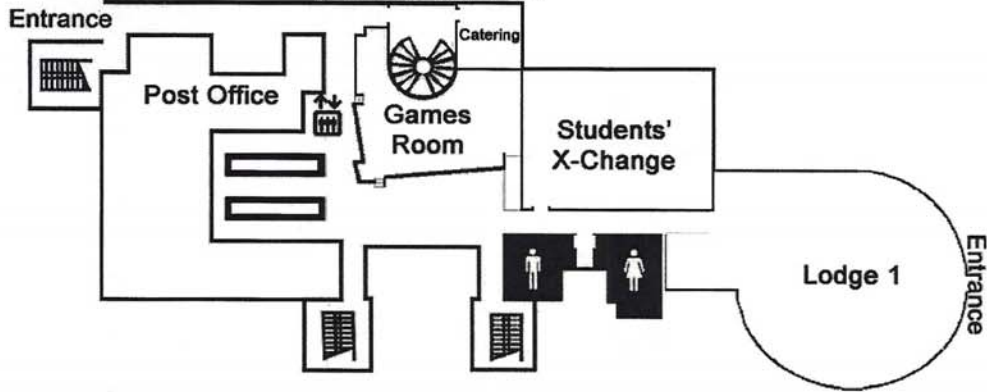

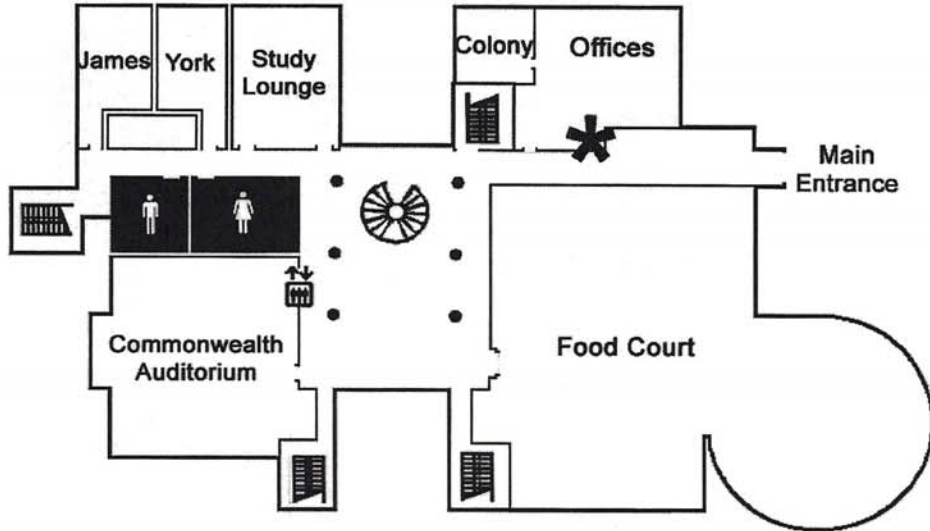

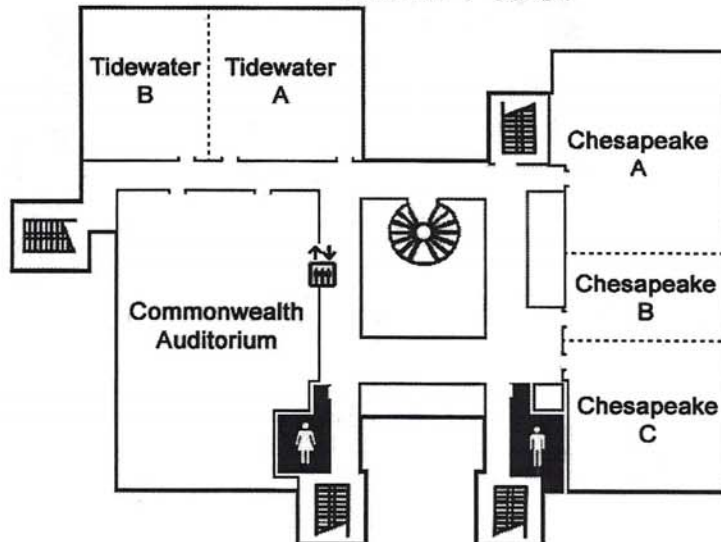
## First Floor



## Second Floor



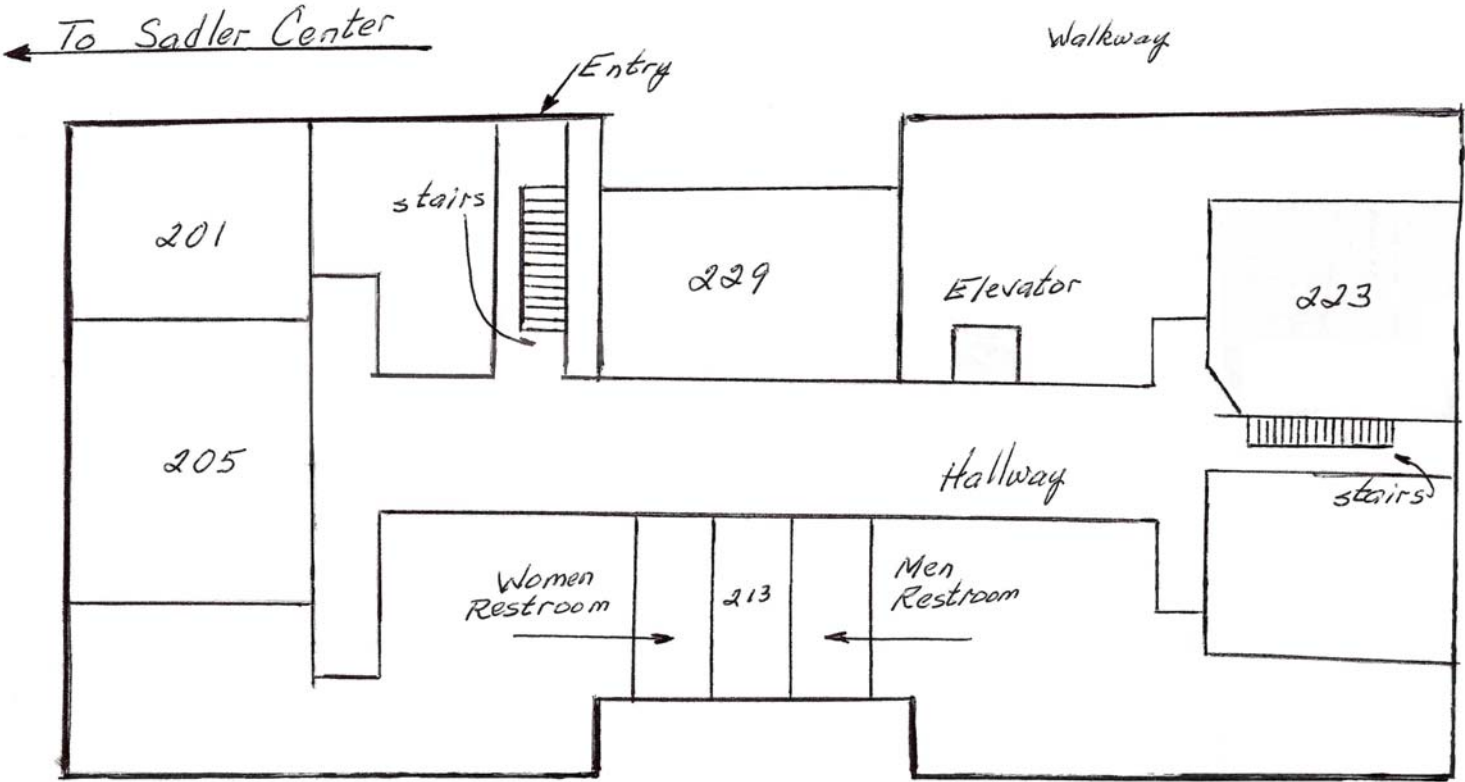
