- II. **Agenda Approval:** Tom Fitzgibbons moved, Perry Pope seconded and the committee voted 21-0 (Walker absent for vote) to approve the agenda as presented.
- III. **Minutes:** Lou Tonelson moved, Steve Koleszar seconded and the committee voted 21-0 (Walker absent for vote) to approve the May 7-8, 2003, Executive Committee minutes.
- IV. **Appointment of Chairman-elect:** Perry Pope moved, Charlie Ostlund seconded and the committee voted 22-0 to approve the recommendation of the Group AAA Selection Committee and appoint Lou Tonelson, Eastern Region representative and principal of Kempsville High School, as chairman-elect.
- V. **Announcement and Call for New Business:** Executive Director Tilley noted that because of the weather conditions, the committee would try to handle all business in one day.
- A. Chairman Karen Whetzel introduced new Executive Committee members Rob Carpenter, Bryan Gordon, Bob Grimesey, Dave Jeck, Oliver McBride, Perry Pope, Gary Silvey, Clint Stables, John Walker, Mary Whitley, Mike Willis and Lee Wise.
- B. Executive Director Tilley reviewed the schedule for the meeting; notebooks; Policy Manual; Leaguer; room arrangements (including October and March); travel vouchers; committee email and phone listing; alternates for meetings and provided members with a Handbook, Directory and Principal's Workbook.
- C. New Business Items:
- a. Site change for Group A/AA Volleyball: Request to hold Group A semifinals at Lafayette and Group AA semifinals at Jamestown with finals for both groups to be held at Lafayette.
- b. Regional Income to VHSL: Recommendation brought forward to substitute a set fee in place of the 35% share of the regional income.
- VI. **Concerns from Public:** None.
- VII. **Finance Committee:** Executive Director Tilley and Director of Finance Garman reported the League ended the 2003 fiscal year with a \$69,747.60 deficit, which was less than the preliminary projected figure of \$225,000.

Jim Garman reported to date we have received \$17,000 in revenue from football benefit games, approximately \$1,000 above the final income for all benefit games last year.

Ken Tilley announced the Foundation Board is working on two fund raising projects, a golf tournament and a Century Club which consists of 100 people willing to commit giving \$1000 to the Foundation.

Jim Garman reported that the auditors have completed the audit for the 2003 fiscal year, we received a good exit report and the final reports will be available at the December Executive Committee meeting.

VIII. **Committee Reports:**

A. **Sportsmanship:**

1. Wachovia/VHSL Sportsmanship, Ethics, Integrity Award (2003): Tom Zimorski noted that the number of schools entering this competition has decreased. Eleven schools qualified for this award.
2. Stay in the Game Awards: Eighty-seven schools, the largest number to date, received an award for having no coach or player ejections during the 2002-03 school year. Region representatives are asked to challenge their region schools to be included on the list for the 2003-04 school year.
3. Sportsmanship Summit: The Sportsmanship Summit is now held in conjunction with the Student Leaders Conference and was well received under the new format last year.
4. Parents for Good Sports: Virginia is one of eight states involved in this pilot program through the National Federation. Stone Bridge High School in Ashburn is Virginia's representative for this program.

B. **Appeals:** Tom Zimorski referred the committee to the Appeals Matrix and reminded region representatives that district committees need to adhere to the guidelines in reference to only three officers voting on appeals; committees also are reminded to follow the timelines.

C. **Sports Medicine:** Assistant Director Bruce Patrick reported the Sports Medicine Committee is in the process of producing the physical form in Spanish and working on protective eye wear for girls lacrosse for the 2003-04 school year.

D. **Debate, Drama, Forensics Advisory Committee:** Assistant Director Button had no additions to the minutes provided to the committee in the pre-mailing.

E. **Scholastic Publications Advisory Committee:** Assistant Director Button had no additions to the minutes provided to the committee in the pre-mailing.

F. **Redistricting and Reclassification:** Ken Tilley announced that the R&R Committee is scheduled to meet on September 25 and will make recommendations for any changes at that time.

G. **2003-04 Committee Appointments:** Rob Carpenter moved, Steve Koleszar seconded and the committee voted 22-0 to approve the committee appointments as presented (Appendix A).

H. **Policy:** Policy Committee chairman Tom Fitzgibbons reported the following recommendations:

- a. Legislation to be brought forth to strike the word "accredited" in 7-1-1 Membership.
- b. Legislation to be brought forth to assist small schools placed in football divisions with larger schools.

Effective with the 2005-06 school year, if a school is placed in a football division and it is 50% of the largest size school in that division, they could appeal their placement.
- c. Leave the Independent Team Rule as is.
- d. Confirm that 30-5-1 (11) "Violation of participation rules in teams sports," which carries a forfeiture penalty, does apply to a school team exceeding the Contest Limitation Rule.

- e. Schools or school divisions requesting that sports/activities be added to the sports/activities listed on the membership application should make a formal request to be reviewed by the Executive Committee.
- f. The Multiple Season Limitation Rule (54-3-1) and Wrestling Weight (88-4-1 (2)) amendments were presented as "emergency" legislation (refer to XI. Legislation).

The following items were discussed with no formal action:

- \$25 fine is sufficient penalty for participation in unsanctioned meet
- Staff will handle clarification on the jamboree sanction form in regard to participation by VHSL schools in an out-of-state jamboree and appropriate processing fee
- Leave the chemical awareness programs and use of supplements as is
- Staff to advise CSIET to notify VHSL when they direct place foreign exchange students

IX. Unfinished Business:

A. **Tennis Seasons:** The following members of the Tennis Committee were approved:

This committee will meet and prepare a survey to be sent to all member schools in order to provide a recommendation to the December Executive Committee meeting in regard to setting the seasons for the 2004-05 school year.

C. **Group AAA State Field Hockey Site:** The committee took no further action on the site approved in May for the State Field Hockey Meet. Thus, the National Field Hockey Training Center in Virginia Beach will be the site of the 2003 state meet.

D. **Finance Policy:** Regional representatives were asked to review the financial policy in regard to the timely submission of region and state reports and income and the enforcement of penalties for non-compliance. This will be an item on the Finance Committee Agenda in December.

X. Legislation: The committee approved the following as emergency legislation effective immediately.

Wrestlers competing in a weight class lower than their proper weight class as established by the VHSL Wrestling Weight Control Program shall be ineligible participants subject to the prescribed penalty of match forfeiture(s) and school fine for use of an ineligible.

XI. **Action Agenda:**

A. **Goals for Executive Director:** George Porterfield moved, Lou Tonelson seconded and the committee voted 22-0 to adopt the following goals set by the executive director and league chairman.

1. (Communication) Work with member schools, the Communication Task Force and other relevant groups to develop an Advocacy Game Plan that can be used by schools and the League staff to promote greater awareness of the VHSL.
2. (Revenue) Assist the Foundation Board of Directors in implementing strategies to grow the Endowment Fund by 60% and lead staff in determining ways to increase attendance and improve atmosphere for participants and fans at state events.
3. (Sportsmanship) Expand sportsmanship program utilizing the website, the Resource Guide, the Student Leaders/Sportsmanship Summit and grassroots initiatives.
4. (Officiating) Continue efforts to enhance high school officiating with emphasis on recruiting, retention and training of officials as well as building a stronger relationship with commissioners and officials associations.

B. **Awards (Regional, State, SMAC):** George Porterfield moved, Larry Compton seconded and the committee voted 22-0 to go into executive session for the protection of privacy of individuals in personal matters not related to public business.

John Walker moved, George Porterfield seconded and the committee voted 22-0 to return to public session.

Steve Koleszar moved, Bob Grimesey seconded and by roll call vote, the committee certified 22-0 that to the best of each member's knowledge that during the executive session only public business matters lawfully exempted from open meeting requirements were discussed; and only such public business matters as were identified in the executive session motion were heard, discussed or considered.

George Porterfield moved, Steve Koleszar seconded and the committee voted 22-0 to approve a resolution by the VHSL Sports Medicine Advisory Committee (SMAC) to honor Larry Johnson and create a new award, the Larry Johnson SMAC Award for significant contributions to the health and safety of VHSL sports participants.

George Porterfield moved, Perry Pope seconded and the committee voted 22-0 to approve Larry Johnson as a recipient of the Torch of Honor Award.

C. **Volleyball Match Scoring:** Rob Carpenter moved, Steve Koleszar seconded and the committee voted 22-0 to approve the policy for volleyball that "Prior to the start of the season, a district council may adopt a modified match format for series other than dual-varsity matches; the match format for non-district, non-dual varsity matches (including invitation tournaments) shall be set by host school."

"Match format" in volleyball would include the number of points that constitute a game and the number of games that constitute a match, but would not include the manner in which points are scored. Districts could opt, for example, to play non-varsity matches in a "best 2 out of 3 games" format, with each game played to 21 points (rally scoring). Districts cannot, however, modify the manner in which points are scored. All games, varsity and non-varsity, must be scored using rally scoring. Traditional (side-out) scoring is not an option.

XII. **Consent Agenda:** Pete Koste moved, Perry Pope seconded and the committee voted 11-11 to remove Item B from the consent agenda. The motion failed.

Steve Koleszar moved, Tom Fitzgibbons seconded and the committee voted 20-2 (Koste and Grimesey voting no) to approve the Consent Agenda thus approving the following:

- A. Approval of VHSL Foundation Board of Directors, designated in accordance with the By-laws, as follows: Karen Whetzel, Delmer Botkin and Lou Tonelson (by principals); Ray Tate and Mark Krebs (by superintendents); Chuck Boone (by AD's); Emilie Tilley (by other representatives).
- B. Approval of the Swim and Dive Committee's recommendation to reduce from eight to four the number of relay teams qualifying from the region to state, effective this 2003-04 school year.

XIII. **Legal Report:** Executive Director Tilley reviewed the Summary of Court Cases since 1994.

XIV. **Discussion and Information:** Executive Director Tilley presented these items to the committee:

- A. **Silent Auction:** The VHSL Foundation will host its second annual Silent Auction prior to the membership meeting on Wednesday, October 15. Among the items for bidding are golf packages, overnight stays at hotels and resorts; gift certificates; golf apparel; autographed CD, pictures, hats and baseballs.
- B. **VTSF Grant:** The Virginia Tobacco Settlement Foundation granted the VHSL \$63,500 to continue the CHAMPS program at Monticello and Nelson County High Schools. Results from the 2003 spring survey found that use of tobacco products had dropped by an astounding 22% due in large part to the implementation of the VHSL CHAMPS program.
- C. **VCU Basketball Report:** The committee directed staff to review the format and marketing of state tournaments to enhance net revenue. Staff has met with VCU and Central Region personnel to discuss bracketing, game time scheduling and special promotion opportunities to provide for the best experience possible. The 2003-04 pairings and schedule were presented.
- D. **NFHS Summer Meetings and Committees Members from Virginia:** The 84th Annual NFHS Summer Meeting was held in Chicago. Ken Tilley, Joyce Sisson and Hannah Catherine Munro attended from the VHSL. Sessions attended included Parents for Good Sports; Volleyball Rally Scoring; Sports Commissioners and Sport Foundations; Medical, Liability and Catastrophic Insurance; Dealing with Policy and Change; NFHS Spirit Coaches Education Program; Finance and Business Managers; Marketing Directors (two blocks); Associate/Assistant Roundtable; NFHS Officials Education Program; State Association Participation Restrictions; Character and Coaches Education; The Americans with Disabilities Act and Executive Directors Roundtable.

Tilley also attended Wrestling Weight Management, Make the Point and NFHS Student Leaders Conference sessions.

Among the most significant items of interest among state associations is the issue of national events. Considerable attention is being given to NFHS involvement in national championships, and this matter should be reviewed by the Executive Committee.

Virginians serving on 2003-04 NFHS Committees include Joe Hicks (softball), John Titus (lacrosse), Tom Zimorski (football), Bob Button (speech) and Ken Tilley (annual meeting).

- E. **NFHS Section Meetings:** Larry Johnson, Joyce Sisson, Ken Tilley and Bruce Patrick will attend the NFHS Section 2 meeting, scheduled for September 21-23. In addition, Ken Tilley and Bruce Patrick will attend a special workshop of Section 1 and Section 2 staff on September 29 in New Jersey to discuss State Competition and Events. Tilley will also attend the Section 3 meeting on September 5-9.
- F. **NFHS Student Leaders Conference:** Twelve students and five adults represented the VHSL at the Third Annual National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) Student Leadership Conference in Indianapolis July 11-14.

School.; and Ghent Snyder, Martinsville H.S.

Adult representatives were Tom Fitzgibbons, Martinsville H.S.; Carly Hassinger and Shane Thomas, Chantilly H.S.; Wendy Truitt-Ralph, Heritage H.S. (Newport News); and Hannah Catherine Munro, VHSL.

- G. **VHSL Student Leaders Conference 2004:** Oscar Smith High School in Chesapeake will host the Eighth Annual VHSL Student Leaders Conference on April 30 and May 1, 2004. Region representatives are asked to encourage schools to participate.
- H. **NFHS Make the Point:** Approximately 50 VHSL schools registered this summer as possible participants, ranking Virginia in the top five states for involvement of schools in this unique event representing a partnership between NFHS, Special Olympics and state associations.
- I. **New ADs Workshop:** The sixth annual VIAAA/VHSL New Athletic Directors Workshop drew 29 administrators who completed an intensive day-and-a-half review August 6-7 at the VHSL office. VIAAA instructors included Jeff Dietze, past president of the VIAAA and director of student activities at West Potomac High School; Deb Tyson, VIAAA Secretary and AD at Albemarle High School; Dick Kemper, VIAAA professional development chairman and athletic director at St. Christopher's School; Donna King, NIAAA Secretary and director of activities at Chantilly High School; and Dave Nelson, VIAAA past president and athletic director at Poquoson High School. The workshop also featured sessions conducted by VHSL Executive Director Ken Tilley and VHSL Assistant Director for Compliance Tom Zimorski.
- J. **VHSL New Principals:** New principals have been invited to meet with Tom Zimorski at their Area Eligible Meeting for a brief VHSL orientation session.
- K. **Assignment of New Schools for 2004-05:** VHSL By-Laws Section 10-1-2 provide that, "Any school which begins its initial operation shall be assigned by the Executive Director to its appropriate district and group according to its first year's projected membership." New schools that we anticipate recommending assignments in December are: two Prince William County schools tentatively named Dominion Valley and Freedom; King's Fork in Suffolk; and Riverbend in Spotsylvania County.
- L. **Out-of-season Practice:** The VHSL Out-of-Season Practice Rule is in essence more restrictive than the rule in neighboring states and as currently written is increasingly more difficult to enforce. Under the umbrella of clinics, camps, passing leagues, open gyms, conditioning programs, etc., coaches are creative in developing opportunities to work with their athletes out of season. In turn, these practices indirectly pressure other schools to maintain the same competitive edge. Student athletes may also be pressured to participate in these out-of- season activities.
- M. **State Swim Meet:** Concerns were raised relative to the facility (the Princess Anne Recreation Center in Virginia Beach) that was used for the 2003 Group AAA State Swim Meet and whether that site met necessary specifications. Even though a city surveyor concluded that the dimensions of the pool length are less than 25 meters (lane 1 is short 1/2 inch and lane 8 is short 3/16 inch), questions remain as to the standards and requirements for measuring facilities as well as the process for certifying potential record performances.
- N. **Wrestling Weight Control Program:** Capital, Dominion and Central Districts and Central Region voted to support a move to the weight control program of the National Wrestling Coaches Association.
- O. **Equity/Diversity:** Committee members are asked to encourage attendance at this session scheduled prior to the Group Board meetings on October 15.
- Q. **Coaches Education Update:** The latest update on the Coaches Education Program was shared with the committee.
